Our School Council has designed the table below -

Good Behaviour	Bad Behaviour
Walk carefully at all times when inside.	Run when inside the school building. X
Only talk with permission when inside.	Talking when standing or walking in a line in school. X
Sit properly on your chair.	Swing on your chair. X
'Remember 'Hand Up' and wait your turn.	Talking 'out of turn' or 'Shouting out' X
Be kind and respectful to everyone.	Be unkind or rude to others. X
Always be ready to listen.	Not paying attention or being selfish. X
Behave properly in the toilets and keep them tidy.	Playing with taps, running and throwing paper towels. x

#### If you behave badly -



You will be given one warning to remind you how to behave.



If you misbehave again, you will be asked to 'take time out' and you may miss some fun activities e.g. play time!



If you misbehave again, you will be sent to see Ms McBurney, Mrs Black or Mr Patterson. Your parents will be informed.



If you misbehave again, you may need to spend some time with Mr Patterson. Your parents will be told.

### Our Happy Playground...

We, the pupils, staff and governors of Larne and Inver Primary School, have agreed the following playground rules. We want to make sure that our playground is always happy, safe and fair FOR EVERYONE. We must be READY, RESPECTFUL and SAFE.

Our School Council has designed the table below -

Good Behaviour	Bad Behaviour
Be kind/gentle and let others play too!	Be rough or don't let others play your game X
Agree the rules and be calm if you lose!	Cheat and be angry when you lose! X
Take care of the play equipment.	Break equipment on purpose/jump on the fence X
Stop playing when the whistle blows.	Ignore the whistle and keep playing. X
Line up quietly and promptly.	Shouting when slowly getting into your line. X
Listen to and respect everyone.	Ignoring others/buddies and being selfish. X



If you misbehave in the playground, you will get one warning from a member of staff in the playground.



If you misbehave again, you will be asked to sit on a bench or in the shelter to think about your behaviour!



If you misbehave again, you will be sent to see Mrs Black, Ms McBurney or Mr Patterson. Your parents will be informed.



If you misbehave again, you may need to spend some time with Mr Patterson. Your parents will be informed.

# We think that if we all agree to these rules, our school will be even more fantastic!



However, certain behaviours e.g. punching, kicking, using bad language or disrespecting/being cheeky to a staff member will mean that you are removed immediately for 'reflection time' to keep everyone safe!

'Reflective 5' is the process used to address any issues -

- √ What happened?
- ✓ Who was annoyed?
- √ How were they annoyed?
- ✓ What can we do to make it right?
- ✓ What can we do differently next time?



Parents are asked to regularly talk about these rules with their children and to use the 'Reflective 5' questions if needed.

Any concerns or queries should be addressed as soon as possible with your child's teacher, Ms McBurney, Mrs Black or Mr Patterson.
